What we've been doing

Since last year's AGM, we have:

- Repainted vital road markings, including crucial safety lines near junctions and clear speed warnings.
- Successfully undertaken 106 sqm of critical **pothole and surface repair** in 28 locations, significantly improving road conditions.
- Continued regular gardening, verge cutting and leaf clearance with Arcadian Services, who remain competitively priced.
- Conducted extensive tree works to keep Kemnal Road clear and safe for all users. This included lifting tree canopies, removing dead or fallen trees, and clearing growth around lampposts and kerbsides for improved visibility.
- Reviewed planning applications impacting our community and liaised with local councillors on safety and broader community matters, representing residents' interests.
- Submitted an application for charitable status. If granted, this would strengthen our legal position, may enable us to obtain supplier discounts, and also allow us to claim Gift Aid, increasing individual subscriptions by 25% at no cost to residents. We will keep members fully informed as this process progresses.

Join the Committee!

We are looking for two **new Committee members**, ideally including representation from the northern section and the side roads. The Committee meets four times a year and plays a vital role in budgeting, managing contractors, reviewing planning applications, and safeguarding the condition and appearance of the road. If you are interested, please contact the Secretary or volunteer at the AGM.

Entrance to Kemnal Road

The Committee is consulting on proposals for a new **entrance** at the top of Kemnal Road, intended to replace the existing "Kemnal Road" sign. The entrance structure will enhance the aesthetic appeal of our road entrance and improve the visibility of the Kemnal Road sign.

We are exploring a range of options, including brick pillars, white picket signs, fixed fences, and granite blocks.

Preliminary sketches illustrating these ideas will be shared with residents at the ACM. We invite all residents to provide their feedback on these proposals. Submissions can be made at our Annual General Meeting on Friday 4th July 2025, or by email.

Your input is crucial as we work together to shape the future appearance of our road.

Your road, your responsibility

Kemnal Road remains a private road, maintained by residents through annual Road Fund subscriptions. This model, established over 70 years ago, continues to serve us well. Thanks to the 2023 subscription increase. prudent management, and new north-end residents, our reserves are improving, ending the most recent financial year at £26,557, up from £17,352 the previous year.

However, continuing to build up our reserves is critical in providing for long-term major resurfacing, as costs continue to escalate and eventual phased replacement will require very significant funding. Having carefully assessed our current and potential future needs, the Committee has decided to keep the per-household subscription for 2025/26 at **£95**, but it is likely that modest increases will be required in future to keep pace with inflation and secure the road's long-term future. Our subscription level still remains well below that of other comparable roads in our area.

Subscription requests will be issued following the AGM. Prompt payment by everyone is vital and appreciated.
